Dear Parents and Carers

I would like to welcome everyone as we begin our new academic year. A big thank you to everyone for making sure that children are wearing the correct uniform and that they are prepared for the term ahead. A special welcome to all the new families who have joined us this year with children in the Foundation Stage or throughout the school; I hope you as parents are finding out all the information you need. #### Stowford School Ofsted Report June 2023:

I was very pleased to share with you the Ofsted Report from the school inspection in June 2023. I really hope that you have had chance to have a look. It is testament to a very hard working and caring team who put the children at the forefront of everything we do.

#### School Buildings and RAAC:

I trust that everyone received the email regarding Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) and that this has served as reassurance. There is a copy of the email on the website in case you missed it.

#### Clubs:

Information regarding extra-curricular clubs will be issued on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> September. The signup deadline for clubs is Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup>, and acceptance slips will be sent home with the children on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup>. Clubs will commence week commencing 25<sup>th</sup>.

I hope you will agree there are lots of lovely activities available across this academic year for the children to enjoy.

Thank you to all the staff who give their time to provide children with enrichment opportunities.

#### ICC Transition for Year 6 Parents & Carers:

There will be a meeting for parents/carers of children in Year 6 at Stowford in the school hall on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> September at 4.00pm. This meeting is intended for parents/carers to attend without children so that there is an opportunity to ask any questions freely. The meeting will last approximately 45 minutes, depending on the number of questions!

There are also Open Evenings at Ivybridge Community College on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September and Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> October at 5.30pm. If you require more information about these Open Evenings, please contact ICC on 01752 691000.

#### Flu Immunisations:

This year children will again be offered a free flu vaccination in school and the immunisation team will shortly be sending communication via the school with regard to consent for this. The immunisations will take place on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November at Stowford School.

#### School Website, Policies and GDPR:

The school website is a useful source of information <u>www.stowford.devon.sch.uk</u> for all parents and carers. Statutory school policies, including details of the complaints procedure and GDPR privacy notices, can be found on the website, under the 'About Us' tab. Safeguarding information is also available on the website under its own tab - this provides details of who to contact should you have any safeguarding concerns. The website is updated regularly and details of school events are included in the calendar.

#### Home School Communication:



Newsletters are sent by email and put on the school website. A paper copy can be collected from the school office if preferred. Please

could you make sure you keep your records up to date and let the school office know of any changes to email addresses, addresses and mobile phone numbers so we can ensure you receive information from school.

#### Data Collection:

Please note that the school continues to use the programme 'Parent App Lite' to enable parents/carers to ensure all contact details are accurate and up to date. Many of you are already using this system successfully and invitations will be sent out to new parents/carers soon.

#### Homework:

Homework will be set on Class Dojo and teachers will use the page alongside the Home School Diary for communication with parents and carers.

#### Book Bags:

We would really appreciate it if all children could have book bags. It not only keeps the books clean and tidy but also provides a useful vehicle for letters and slips when young children sometimes find it hard to carry a lot of things at the same time. These can be purchased from the school office for  $\pm 5$ . (Plain book bags are available from Lawsons in Ivybridge). Water bottles are also available at the school office for  $\pm 1$ . Cash payment is required for these items and the correct money preferred as change is not always available in the school office.

#### School Meals:

Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) continue this year for children in Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2. Children in Year 3 and above must pay for school meals. The cost of school meals has increased to £2.53 (in line with DfE pricing) and all meals should be pre-ordered via ParentPay please. The existing Devon Norse Menu continues until the October half-term holiday.

Pupil Premium Free School Meals: Please do ensure that you speak to the office if you think you may be eligible for benefit related free school meals. The application process is online via the Citizen Portal: Citizen Portal - Sign in (devon.gov.uk). It is worth registering if you are eligible as this attracts considerable extra funding for your child's education, even if your child does not actually have a school meal. Please also apply even if your child is in receipt of UIFSM, as the school will still receive additional funding which benefits your child and the school. For all children, please ensure that you preorder school lunches via ParentPay. Please contact the school office if you require any help with this.

#### Attendance/Holidays in Term Time:

Please see the School Attendance Policy for detailed information and guidance.

Regular attendance at school is essential to ensure that children achieve well and have a wealth of experiences across the curriculum. Holidays in term time are strongly discouraged, and you will no doubt be aware that Government directives do not allow for authorisation of holidays during term time, unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Requests for absence should be submitted on an S2 form, available from the school office or to download on the website.

Where a request is not authorised this does not prevent you from taking your child out of school, but schools are required to notify the Local Education Authority if a student has unauthorised absences. If your child has unauthorised absences from school, this could result in a school absence penalty notice being issued. For further information see

#### Absence due to ill health:

If your child is unwell, please let the <u>school office</u> know before 8.45am on the day of absence in accordance with safeguarding requirements. A letter should follow confirming the reason for absence when your child returns to school. Please note that you must ring and leave a message every day that your child will not be attending school so that we can ensure all children are safely accounted for. There is an answer machine specifically for absence reporting and callers can leave a telephone message at any time when the school office is not open. Telephone: 01752 894163. Please <u>do not</u> advise absence via *ClassDojo*.

#### Home time arrangements:

Please remember that in order to safeguard the children we need to be informed if there is a change to usual home time arrangements by the relevant parent. Please put the information in writing in a letter or note in the home school diary. Last minute changes can be advised by phone. Children will not be allowed to go with another parent/carer unless we have been informed. We hope you understand that this is in your child's best interests.

#### PE/Sports:

**Earrings**: due to the difficulty that some children have in removing earrings for PE, and the potential loss of earrings once removed, we would request that children do not wear earrings on PE days. We would greatly appreciate your support with this as children can become upset when asked to remove their own earrings if this is something they are not used to doing. On non-PE days, earrings should be simple studs only.

**Football:** children love to play football at break and lunch and we want them to have fun and keep fit. Children need to wear shin pads if they wish to play and if they are to be 'goalie' will need to wear gloves to protect their fingers. Children may bring their own (named) if they wish to and school will provide some spares.

Following guidelines, balls must be size 3 or 4; no one will be allowed to use a size 5 ball. To support this, school will supply appropriate balls. Please do not bring balls from home.

#### Wild Tribe:

Wild Tribe (outdoor education) will continue this this year, but there are some changes to the method of delivery and the timetable for this subject.

Foundation - Wild Tribe will be part of the continuous provision on a daily basis. Both Mrs Lamerton and Mrs Hill are qualified practitioners.

Year 1 - Wild Tribe will be led by Mrs Tickner and will be weekly. Parents will be notified of the start date in due course.

Years 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 - Miss Kee will teach a unit of Wild Tribe in the second half of the summer term based on fire skills. In addition to this, each year group will have a full Wild Tribe day in the autumn term and in the first half of the summer term. This full day will provide the opportunity for total immersion in the Wild Tribe experience. Dates for these will be shared with parents nearer the time.

PLEASE NOTE THIS IS A CHANGE FOR Y2.

In order for the children to participate fully in Wild Tribe, it is imperative that children wear suitable clothing - tracksuit bottoms and fleece/warm top that can be worn over PE shirt and shorts. The children will also require wellies; these should be in a named bag in school as they are also required for lunchtime play.

#### Reading:

Congratulations to the 84 Stowford children who completed the Ivybridge Reading Challenge! This is a lot of reading!! The librarians have spoken very highly of the children so well done to you all!

#### Accelerated Reader:

This year, children who are reading books from the Accelerated Reader (AR) scheme will be able to choose from a wider band of books.

Children will complete their Star Reader tests at the start of every half term. This will give them a range, e.g., 2.3 -3.3. Children can read any book within that range and will be quizzed on it once finished.

Please do let your child's teacher know if there are any issues with AR books.

#### School Uniform Purchases:

There is also a clothes rail of pre-loved, donated uniform located in the school reception stocked with good-quality items available to purchase for a small donation to Stowford Friends PTA. School water bottles (£1) and book bags (£5) can still be purchased at the school office - please bring the correct money if you wish to purchase items to reduce cash handling in the office.

#### Volunteers in school:

We are keen to have volunteers in school and grateful for the help that parents and carers offer. Volunteers are asked to complete an application form and will have an appointment with Mrs Williams to make them aware of safeguarding procedures and guidance and agree an area in which to volunteer. In line with good safeguarding practice, all regular volunteers must undergo an Enhanced DBS check; details of the DBS checks are recorded on the school's Single Central Record (SCR).
